Headline Numbers for the Education Sector (latest available)

The education sector is the third most important sector in the Manawatu region in terms of economic activity (GDP). Key indicators are:

5,175 children attended early childhood education in 2017, a 4.9% increase from 2016.

97.2% of children starting school in 2017 had attended early childhood education (96.9% for New Zealand).

12,426 students enrolled in primary and intermediate school (years 1-8) in July 2017, 2.1% increase from 2016.


7,607 students enrolled in secondary school (years 9-15), 1.3% increase from 2016.

245 international students enrolled in schools in 2017 (increase of 13.4% from 2016) and 1,671 international students in higher education (increase of 1.3% from 2016). International education contributed \$67.8 million to Manawatū region GDP in 2015/16.

1,547 school leavers in 2016: 36.3% achieved university standard (40.7% for New Zealand) and 10.0% did not achieve at least NCEA level 1 (10.6% for New Zealand).

6,300 jobs in education in February 2017, a 1.6% increase from 2016.

\$381 million earnings (salaries, wages and self-employment income) in the year ended March 2016, an increase of 5.3% from 2015.
