EMPLOYMENT

An additional 1,021 regional residents were employed in the year to Sept 2023 compared with the same period in 2022, taking total employment to 57,987.

ELECTRONIC CARD CONSUMER SPENDING

Spending in the region fell below the rate of inflation over the year to September 2023. This indicates a real decline in spending as higher mortgage interest rates and the cost of living puts pressure on household budgets.

UNEMPLOYMENT

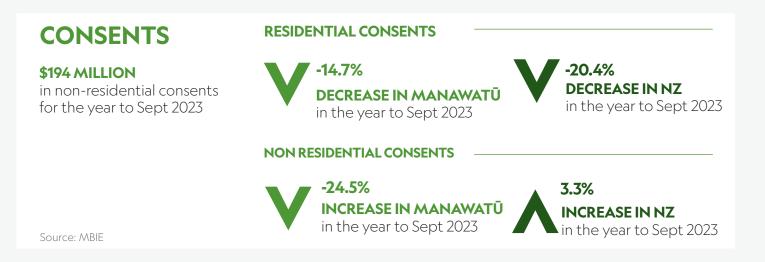
Unemployment in the region remains low but there are signs of easing labour market conditions as overseas workers boost the number of workers in the region.
